Casey Gwinn

Mr. Gwinn serves as the Director of Victim Services for the San Diego County District Attorney's Office and as the National Director for the President's Family Justice Center Initiative. Casey has been recognized by *The American Lawyer* magazine as one of the top 45 public lawyers in America. Mr. Gwinn served for eight years as the elected City Attorney of San Diego from 1996 to 2004. Prior to entering elected office, Casey founded the City Attorney's Child Abuse and Domestic Violence Unit, leading the Unit from 1986 to 1996.

Mr. Gwinn currently serves on the Department of Justice's National Advisory Council on Domestic Violence and chairs the California Attorney General's Task Force on Domestic Violence. He also recently served on a congressionally created Department of Defense Task Force, studying the handling of family violence throughout the Department of Defense.

Mr. Gwinn has received many local and national awards, including the Stephen L. Lewis Lecturer of Merit Award from the National College of District Attorneys, the Women's International Living Legacy Award, the Men's Leadership Forum Hometown Hero Award, Sharp Healthcare's Excellence in Education Award, the San Diego Press Club's Diogenes Award, the San Diego Mediation Center's Peacemaker Award, the San Diego Ecumenical Council's Christian Unity Award, and, most recently, the Advocate of the Year Award presented on Disability Independence Day from the disabled community in San Diego.



Sharon O'Neill-Mai

Ms. O'Neill-Mai is the Director of all Victim Services for the Hudson County Prosecutor's Office. This includes being the Victim-Witness Coordinator, the Director of the newly developed Child Advocacy Center and the Multi-Disciplinary Team Coordinator.

Ms. O'Neill-Mai is the original founding member of the Victim-Witness Advocacy Association in the state of New Jersey and served as both Chairman and Treasurer. She is currently on the National Organization for Victim Assistance Board of Directors. She is also a certified expert trainer in the field of victimization in New Jersey. Ms. O'Neill-Mai is a member of the Advisory Board of the New Jersey Victims of Crime Compensation Board, and she is a consultant for the New Jersey Law Center on issues of victimization. Ms. O'Neill-Mai's positions include being a Co-Chairman of the Post 9/11 Response Team for Safe Haven East Coalition. She is also a member of the National Organization for Victim Assistance Crisis Response Team.

Frances B. Pelliccia, M.D.

Dr. Pelliccia is a SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner) for the Hudson County Adult Rape Program. She joins the Team of the Hudson County Prosecutor's Office SAVA Unit and Victim-Witness Unit at the Hudson County Child Advocacy Center to continue her work on behalf of the children of Hudson County.

Dr. Pelliccia has been recognized for her work with abused children by numerous agencies. She received the Morton Bard Award from NOVA (National Organization for Victim Assistance) and teaches an annual workshop in child abuse for NOVA. She received an award from the Hudson County Child Abuse Prevention Agency presented by Martha Lewin, Executive Director of Woman Rising.

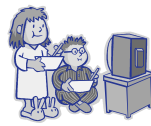

She graduated from UMDNJ Newark, NJ and completed two Residencies, one in Internal Medicine and the other in Pediatrics, at UMDNJ. She has recently completed her course work in the Master's Program of Forensic Psychology at John Jay College of Criminal Justice and will be doing her thesis in the area of Child Abuse.

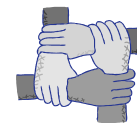

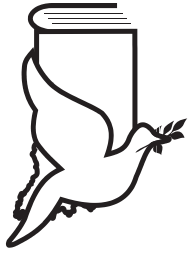
